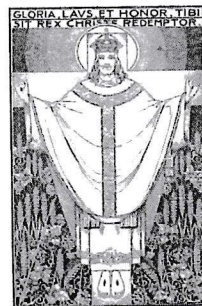

THE CANONIZATION OF CARDINAL JOHN HENRY NEWMAN (1801-1890)

On Tuesday last, the Holy See announced that Blessed John Henry Newman would be declared a saint at a ceremony in Rome on 13th October. This was in response to a verified second miracle procured through his intercession. There have been quite a number of English martyr saints from the penal times canonized in the 20th century. John Henry is the first non-martyr Englishman for many centuries to be declared a saint. His influence and reputation extends way beyond our shores. There are schools in South America dedicated to him and his renown as a theologian is celebrated in the USA and throughout Europe. Here in England the Birmingham Oratory and the locally situated Oratory Schools (prep & senior) owe their foundation to him. The school was originally located in Birmingham and came south in the early part of the 20th century. Newman's writings and correspondence extend to many volumes and represent some of the most original and exceptional contributions to spiritual and theological thought ever composed. The canonization will be a day of profound joy and significance to many people who have prayed and worked for it tirelessly over decades. The Oratory congregation of priests, introduced into England by Newman, will no doubt also rejoice in this recognition of their founder, a seeker after truth and authenticity.
